- Readings, sermon, creed, intercessions •
- Peace, offertory, Great Thanksgiving •

Some key sections from the Great Thanksgiving
(aka the Eucharistic Prayer)

**Epiclesis (prayer for the coming of the spirit)
upon the gifts:**

We praise and bless you, loving Father,
through Jesus Christ, our Lord;
and as we now obey his command,
send your Holy Spirit,
that broken bread and wine outpoured
may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

Institution narrative:

On the night before he died
he had supper with his friends
and taking bread, he praised you.
He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.
When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.
Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Anamnesis (making explicit the 'in remembrance'):
So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice
made once for all upon the cross.
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory:
Christ has died
Christ is risen
Christ will come again.

**Epiclesis (prayer for the coming of the spirit)
upon the people:**

Lord of all life,
help us to work together towards that day
when your kingdom comes
and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with all the saints
to feast at your table in heaven.

Doxology (concluding praise):
Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father,
for ever and ever. Amen.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:
Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.

but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
